



New Art in Bryant Park

MIDTOWN/MIDTOWN WEST—As the weather gets warmer, the number of public art installations around the city will multiply... which is awesome because now people can actually enjoy them without freezing to death while introspecting or something. Over in Bryant Park, Art Production Fund’s project, “One-Two-Three” by the late Tony Smith, was installed yesterday. The three-part sculpture, which is made of steel and weighs in at a combined 2,700 pounds, is intended to be a “conversation starter.” More important, though, is that it’s meant to celebrate Smith’s legacy as a pioneer and initiator of New York City’s public art program in parks in 1967.
